We extend a warm welcome to all who attend our Church. We hope that you will find our parish community a place where your life of faith will be nourished. The scriptures and symbols and masses and prayers of Holy Week

have lead us to Easter! Alleluia!

On Holy Thursday we remembered Jesus on his knees washing the dirty, smelly feet of his disciples. We remember that he asks his disciples and now us if we understand what he did. In general our response is yes. Yet on Good Friday we remember his passion and death. We were challenged on that day to ask ourselves how much we love our family and friends and even the neighbors we do not know. Can we go to the cross and die for others is the question that all of us are invited to answer.

Holy Saturday then brought us the symbols of the resurrection! The fire of the Holy Spirit outside the church. That same fire lighting the Easter Candle. The procession with the Easter Candle into the darkened church. The light of Christ scattering the literal darkness. Then the scriptures speaking to us of a rebirth. On this night we walk through Genesis and Exodus prior to coming to the New Testament where we again sing the Gloria. Prior to the Gospel we get to raise our hearts and voices with the Alleluia that we have not heard throughout Lent.

It is at this mass that our adult candidates receive their confirmation and communion. These men and women have walked through a process with their families, sponsors and catechists. They have learned more about God, the Church and themselves. Thus they were sealed with the Holy Spirit in confirmation and joyfully took the body and blood of Christ into their very bodies for the first time.

We rise this morning, Easter Sunday, to the gospel of John and the empty tomb. Mary Magdalene was the first person at the tomb. It is on her word that Peter and “the other disciple” run to the tomb. Although the other disciple beats Peter to the entrance of the tomb he does not go in but waits for Peter. After Peter enters to see that Jesus’ body was not there the “other disciple also went in...he saw and believed.”

This Easter we are challenged again to believe in Jesus Christ risen from the dead. We have the testimony of those who were present. We have their word as part of the Word of God. We also have the testimony of the church throughout history as well as the present day testimony of believers. These people from the present day are all of us. We give testimony as Mary Magdalene did, as Peter and all the disciples did. We know that what we have just celebrated in Holy Week is true. Christ is Risen! Christ is truly Risen! Alleluia! Fr. La Palabra de Dios, los símbolos, misas y oraciones de la Semana Santa nos han dirigido a la Pascua! Aleluya!

El Jueves Santo estuvimos recordando a Jesús arrodado y lavando los pies sucios de sus discípulos. El pregunta a sus discípulos y ahora a nosotros si comprendemos lo que el ha hecho. En general podemos decir que si. Aunque en Viernes Santo el desafio para nosotros es si verdaderamente amamos a nuestras familias, familiares, amigos y hasta el vecino no conocido. Podemos irnos a la cruz y morir para los demás?

Sábado de Gloria tuvimos los símbolos de nuestra fe en la resurrección! El fuego del Espíritu Santo fuera de la iglesia. Luego el mismo fuego prendiendo el cirio Pascual. La procesión con el cirio Pascual entrando una iglesia oscura. Fue la luz de Cristo conquistando la oscuridad del pecado en una manera literal. Las escrituras nos hablaron de la creación del mundo en Génesis y el libro de Éxodo nos hace recordar de nuestra libertad. Todo esto antes del Nuevo Testamento y cantando la Gloria. Justo antes del evangelio tenemos de nuevo la aleluya por la primera vez en las seis semanas de la cuaresma.

También en le misa de Sábado de Gloria tuvimos los adultos o sea candidatos recibieron su primera comunión y confirmación. Estos hombres y mujeres estaban andando por un proceso de aprender de nuestra fe con sus familias, sponsors y catequistas. Han captado mas de Dios, de la Iglesia y de si mismo. Por eso recibieron el sellos del Espíritu Santo en la confirmación y con mucha alegría comulgaron el Cuerpo y Sangre de Cristo por la primera vez en sus vidas!

Nos levantamos esta mañana al evangelio de San Juan con el sepulcro vacío. María Magdalena fue la primera persona al sepulcro. Fue por la palabra de ella que Pedro y “el otro discípulo...iban corriendo juntos” al sepulcro. El otro discípulo lleo antes de Pedro pero no entro. Pedro entro para poder de ver que el cuerpo de Jesús ya no esta en la tumba. El otro entro “vio y creyó.”

Esta Pascua el desafio nuestro es creer en Jesucristo resucitado de entre los muertos. Tenemos el testimonio de los discípulos presentes en aquellos días. Tenemos su palabra como parte de la Palabra de Dios. También el testimonio de todos en la Iglesia Católica a lo largo de los siglos. Hoy somos su testigo. Tanto María Magdalena y Pedro en aquellos días como nosotros hoy, somos los testigos de la resurrección. Sabemos que lo que acabamos de celebrar en la semana santa es la verdad espiritualmente e históricamente. Cristo Resucito! Aleluya!

Vaticano II—Dei Verbum

The principal purpose to which the plan of the old covenant was directed was to prepare for the coming of Christ, the redeemer of all and of the messianic kingdom, to announce this coming by prophecy (see Luke 24:44; John 5:39; 1 Peter 1:10), and to indicate its meaning through various types (see 1 Cor. 10:12). Now the books of the Old Testament, in accordance with the state of mankind before the time of salvation established by Christ, reveal to all men the knowledge of God and of man and the ways in which God, just and merciful, deals with men. These books, though they also contain some things which are incomplete and temporary, nevertheless show us true divine pedagogy. (1) These same books, then, give expression to a lively sense of God, contain a store of sublime teachings about God, sound wisdom about human life, and a wonderful treasury of prayers, and in them the mystery of our salvation is present in a hidden way. Christians should receive them with reverence.

God, the inspirer and author of both Testaments, wisely arranged that the New Testament be hidden in the Old and the Old be made manifest in the New. (2) For, though Christ established the new covenant in His blood (see Luke 22:20; 1 Cor. 11:25), still the books of the Old Testament with all their parts, caught up into the proclamation of the Gospel, (3) acquire and show forth their full meaning in the New Testament (see Matt. 5:17; Luke 24:27; Rom. 16:25-26; 2 Cor. 14:16) and in turn shed light on it and explain it.

THE NEW TESTAMENT

The word God, which is the power of God for the salvation of all who believe (see Rom. 1:16), is set forth and shows its power in a most excellent way in the writings of the New Testament. For when the fullness of time arrived (see Gal. 4:4), the Word was made flesh and dwelt among us in His fullness of graces and truth (see John 1:14). Christ established the kingdom of God on earth, manifested His Father and Himself by deeds and words, and completed His work by His death, resurrection and glorious Ascension and by the sending of the Holy Spirit. Having been lifted up from the earth, He draws all men to Himself (see John 12:32, Greek text), He who alone has the words of eternal life (see John 6:68). This mystery had not been manifested to other generations as it was now revealed to His holy Apostles and prophets in the Holy Spirit (see Eph. 3:4-6, Greek text), so that they might preach the Gospel, stir up faith in Jesus, Christ and Lord, and gather together the Church. Now the writings of the New Testament stand as a perpetual and divine witness to these realities.

Vaticano II—Dei Verbum

La economía del Antiguo Testamento estaba ordenada, sobre todo, para preparar, anunciar proféticamente y significar con diversas figuras la venida de Cristo redentor universal y la del Reino Mesianico. mas los libros del Antiguo Testamento manifiestan a todos el conocimiento de Dios y del hombre, y las formas de obrar de Dios justo y misericordioso con los hombres, según la condición del género humano en los tiempos que precedieron a la salvación establecida por Cristo. Estos libros, aunque contengan también algunas cosas imperfectas y adaptadas a sus tiempos, demuestran, sin embargo, la verdadera pedagogía divina. Por tanto, los cristianos han de recibir devotamente estos libros, que expresan el sentimiento vivo de Dios, y en los que se encierran sublimes doctrinas acerca de Dios y una sabiduría salvadora sobre la vida del hombre, y tesoros admirables de oración, y en los que, por fin, está latente el misterio de nuestra salvación.

Dios, pues, inspirador y autor de ambos Testamentos, dispuso las cosas tan sabiamente que el Nuevo Testamento está latente en el Antiguo y el Antiguo está patente en el Nuevo. Porque, aunque Cristo fundó el Nuevo Testamento en su sangre, no obstante los libros del Antiguo Testamento recibidos íntegramente en la proclamación evangélica, adquieren y manifiestan su plena significación en el Nuevo Testamento, ilustrándolo y explicándolo al mismo tiempo.

EL NUEVO TESTAMENTO

Excelencia del Nuevo Testamento

La palabra divina que es poder de Dios para la salvación de todo el que cree, se presenta y manifiesta su vigor de manera especial en los escritos del Nuevo Testamento. Pues al llegar la plenitud de los tiempos el Verbo se hizo carne y habitó entre nosotros lleno de gracia y de verdad. Cristo instauró el Reino de Dios en la tierra, manifestó a su Padre y a Sí mismo con obras y palabras y completó su obra con la muerte, resurrección y gloriosa ascensión, y con la misión del Espíritu Santo. Levantado de la tierra, atrae a todos a Sí mismo, El, el único que tiene palabras de vida eterna. pero este misterio no fue descubierto a otras generaciones, como es revelado ahora a sus santos Apóstoles y Profetas en el Espíritu Santo, para que predicaran el Evangelio, suscitaran la fe en Jesús, Cristo y Señor, y congregaran la Iglesia. De todo lo cual los escritos del Nuevo Testamento son un testimonio perenne y divino.

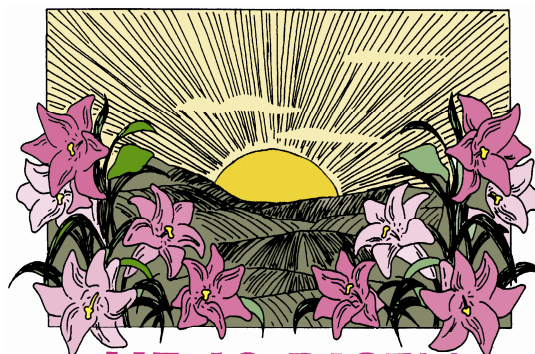

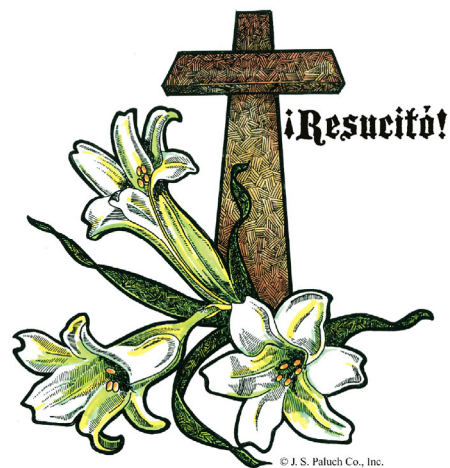
