The Ascension of the Lord gives us hope for the mission to “make disciples

of all nations.”

The Lord is risen and has been with his disciples teaching them about the resurrection and showing them that he is alive. Now at the end of the Gospel of Mathew the disciples and us are given our mission directly from the risen Lord.

Galilee is the setting for this final scene in Mathew. Galilee is on the edge of pagan territory and a generally poor region. The mountain is one of places throughout the gospels Jesus teaches and preaches. In fact mountains are in scenes throughout the bible. In Mathew it was where Jesus taught about the beatitudes.

“When they saw him they worshiped, but they doubted.” That the gospel writer would include this helps us to understand the leap of faith that all of us are called to make. Here are Jesus’ disciples post resurrection still struggling with doubt about the resurrection. Yet they saw him and have been with him for some time now.

Their doubts do not matter to the Lord. Jesus Christ knows that they will continue to struggle in their faith. Yet he sends them out to make disciples of all the world, “baptizing them in the name of the Father and of the Son and of the Holy Spirit.” The Lord instructs them to teach others to “observe all that I have commanded you.” These commands began in Galilee after the temptations in the desert with the beatitudes. His commands climax in Mathew when we are told to love God with all that we are to love our neighbor as ourselves.

Acts then helps us to understand that the first disciples were to wait in Jerusalem for the coming of the Holy Spirit: “the promise of the Father about which you have heard me speak.” Luke, who wrote Acts, emphasizes that “you will receive power when the Holy Spirit comes upon you.” Jesus concludes in Acts by sending them out to the “ends of the earth” or as in Mathew to all nations and peoples.

In Acts the disciples are standing looking up at the sky where Jesus has just ascended. Two angels come to them and reassure them that Jesus “will return in the same way as you have seen him going into heaven.” It is in this hope that the disciples are to “go” and evangelize. They evangelize in the Spirit of wisdom that comes to us through Christ, who is head of the church. We, the body of Christ in the world, are called to go out in the hope of the resurrection and build God’s Kingdom, simply, heaven on earth!

La Ascensión del Señor nos da esperanza para la misión que es irnos por todas las naciones, enseñando y bautizando.

El Señor esta resucitado y estaba con sus discípulos enseñados sobre la resurrección y dándoles una prueba de que El vive. Estamos al final del evangelio de San Mateo y tenemos la misión directamente del Señor resucitado.

Galilea es el sitio por la ultimas palabras del Señor en San Mateo. Galilea esta al borde con la gente pagana y mayormente es gente pobre. La montaña es un lugar por los evangelios y en verdad por toda la Biblia donde Dios nos habla y nos enseña. En San Mateo Jesús nos dio la bienaventuranza después de subir la monte.

“Al ver a Jesús, se postraron, aunque algunos titubeaban.” El evangelista, Mateo, puso este detalle para poder de instruirnos que necesitamos creer en el Señor con todo nuestro ser. Tenemos el ejemplo de los primeros discípulos del Señor luchando con la duda a pesar de estar con Jesús resucitado por un tiempo.

Sus dudas no le importa al Señor. Jesucristo sabe que ellos y nosotros vamos a luchar con nuestra fe. De todas maneras El les mando para hacer discípulos de todas las naciones, “Bautizándolas en el nombre del Padre, del Hijo y del Espíritu Santo.” El les mando con las instrucciones de enseñar a los demás “a cumplir todo cuanto yo les he mandado.” Sus mandatos o sea mandamientos empiezan en Galilea justo después de la tentaciones en el desierto con la bienaventuranza. El mandamiento mas importante en San Mateo es cuando el Señor nos dice que hay que amar a Dios y a nuestro prójimo como a nosotros mismos.

Los Hechos de los Apóstoles, la primera lectura, nos ayude a entender que los primeros discípulos tienen que esperar en Jerusalén para el Espíritu Santo: “la promesa de mi Padre, de la que ya les he hablado.” San Lucas, quien escribió Hechos, quiere enfatizar que “cuando el Espíritu Santo descienda sobre ustedes los llenara de fortaleza.” Jesús termina la primera lectura mandándolos por todo el mundo como en San Mateo.

En la primera lectura los discípulos están mirando al cielo donde Jesús ascendió. Dos ángeles están allá para poder de asegurarnos que el mismo Jesús “volverá como han visto alejarse” al cielo. Por esta esperanza los discípulos están mandados para poder de evangelizar.

Van a evangelizar con el Espíritu de sabiduría que viene en Jesucristo, quien es la cabeza de toda la Iglesia. Nosotros, que somos el cuerpo de Cristo en el mundo, estamos llamados a evangelizar en la esperanza de la resurrección. Así podemos asistir en la construcción del Reino de Dios aquí en la tierra!

Vaticán II—Dei Verbum

Easy access to Sacred Scripture should be provided for all the Christian faithful. That is why the Church from the very beginning accepted as her own that very ancient Greek translation; of the Old Testament which is called the septuagint; and she has always given a place of honor to other Eastern translations and Latin ones especially the Latin translation known as the vulgate. But since the word of God should be accessible at all times, the Church by her authority and with maternal concern sees to it that suitable and correct translations are made into different languages, especially from the original texts of the sacred books. And should the opportunity arise and the Church authorities approve, if these translations are produced in cooperation with the separated brethren as well, all Christians will be able to use them.

The bride of the incarnate Word, the Church taught by the Holy Spirit, is concerned to move ahead toward a deeper understanding of the Sacred Scriptures so that she may increasingly feed her sons with the divine words. Therefore, she also encourages the study of the holy Fathers of both East and West and of sacred liturgies. Catholic exegetes then and other students of sacred theology, working diligently together and using appropriate means, should devote their energies, under the watchful care of the sacred teaching office of the Church, to an exploration and exposition of the divine writings. This should be so done that as many ministers of the divine word as possible will be able effectively to provide the nourishment of the Scriptures for the people of God, to enlighten their minds, strengthen their wills, and set men's hearts on fire with the love of God. (1) The sacred synod encourages the sons of the Church and Biblical scholars to continue energetically, following the mind of the Church, with the work they have so well begun, with a constant renewal of vigor. (2)

Sacred theology rests on the written word of God, together with sacred tradition, as its primary and perpetual foundation. By scrutinizing in the light of faith all truth stored up in the mystery of Christ, theology is most powerfully strengthened and constantly rejuvenated by that word. For the Sacred Scriptures contain the word of God and since they are inspired really are the word of God; and so the study of the sacred page is, as it were, the soul of sacred theology. (3) By the same word of Scripture the ministry of the word also, that is, pastoral preaching, catechetics and all Christian instruction, in which the liturgical homily must hold the foremost place, is nourished in a healthy way and flourishes in a holy way.

Vaticán II—Dei Verbum

. Es conveniente que los cristianos tengan amplio acceso a la Sagrada Escritura. Por ello la Iglesia ya desde sus principios, tomó como suya la antiquísima versión griega del Antiguo Testamento, llamada de los Setenta, y conserva siempre con honor otras traducciones orientales y latinas, sobre todo la que llaman Vulgata. Pero como la palabra de Dios debe estar siempre disponible, la Iglesia procura, con solicitud materna, que se redacten traducciones aptas y fieles en varias lenguas, sobre todo de los textos primitivos de los sagrados libros. Y si estas traducciones, oportunamente y con el beneplácito de la Autoridad de la Iglesia, se llevan a cabo incluso con la colaboración de los hermanos separados, podrán usarse por todos los cristianos.

La esposa del Verbo Encarnado, es decir, la Iglesia, enseñada por el Espíritu Santo, se esfuerza en acercarse, de día en día, a la más profunda inteligencia de las Sagradas Escrituras, para alimentar sin desfallecimiento a sus hijos con la divina enseñanzas; por lo cual fomenta también convenientemente el estudio de los Santos Padres, tanto del Oriente como del Occidente, y de las Sagradas Liturgias. Los exegetas católicos, y demás teólogos deben trabajar, aunando diligentemente sus fuerzas, para investigar y proponer las Letras divinas, bajo la vigilancia del Sagrado Magisterio, con los instrumentos oportunos, de forma que el mayor número posible de ministros de la palabra puedan repartir fructuosamente al Pueblo de Dios el alimento de las Escrituras, que ilumine la mente, robustezca las voluntades y encienda los corazones de los hombres en el amor de Dios. El Sagrado Concilio anima a los hijos de la Iglesia dedicados a los estudios bíblicos, para que la obra felizmente comenzada, renovando constantemente las fuerzas, la sigan realizando con todo celo, según el sentir de la Iglesia.

Importancia de la Sagrada Escritura para la Teología

La Sagrada Teología se apoya, como en cimientos perpetuos en la palabra escrita de Dios, al mismo tiempo que en la Sagrada Tradición, y con ella se robustece firmemente y se rejuvenece de continuo, investigando a la luz de la fe toda la verdad contenida en el misterio de Cristo. Las Sagradas Escrituras contienen la palabra de Dios y, por ser inspiradas, son en verdad la palabra de Dios; por consiguiente, el estudio de la Sagrada Escritura ha de ser como el alma de la Sagrada Teología. También el ministerio de la palabra, esto es, la predicación pastoral, la catequesis y toda instrucción cristiana, en que es preciso que ocupe un lugar importante la homilía litúrgica, se nutre saludablemente y se vigoriza santamente con la misma palabra de la Escritura.
