WELCOME TO ST. RITA

We extend a warm welcome to all who attend our Church. We hope that you will find our parish community a place where your life of faith will be nourished. We also hope that you will share your special gifts within the community. Your prayers, your presence, and your talents are most welcome. May God bless all of us!



On World Mission Sunday we realize again that our church is essentially missionary. Our own parish was a mission church for many years in the diocese.

The Gospel today is the classic moment about money and what to do with it. Specifically it is about paying taxes to Caesar. The Pharisees are looking for a way to trap Jesus. This is chapter 22 in Mathew's gospel thus very soon, chapter 26, Jesus will be in Pilate's hands. Note how they approach him, "Teacher we know that you are a truthful man and that you teach the way of God in accordance with the truth." These false platitudes Jesus sees through: "Why are you testing me you hypocrites?"

Jesus' answer to the question about paying taxes is subtle. He asks them to simply show him the coin. Although the text has them handing him the Roman coin most scholars believe that he never touched the coin. "Whose image is this and whose inscription?" he inquires. "Caesar's," they reply. "Then give to Caesar what is Caesar's and to God what belongs to God." The key for us is the freedom to give the money that we have. Jesus does not say you must pay this tax. He invites us into a life that is not controlled by money.

Next May our community will begin celebrating our 100th anniversary! The agreement between the Benedictine monks at St. Leo's and a very small community of Catholics here in Dade City occurred in 1912. The first mass was actually on March 4, 1913. It was difficult for the monks to come to Dade City in those days. There was no route 52 or easily passable roads. So they made quite a sacrifice to start the parish. The diocese had given the monks permission to start parishes where needed in this part of Pasco county.

As we approach this wonderful moment in our history we need to fix up a few things. First, we need to paint the inside of our church. The hall was painted about a year and one-half ago. Now the church needs a good painting. Also our parking lot is in need of repair and new lines. So the Finance Council and I would like you to consider three options: a second collection (this might increase our Annual Pastoral Appeal goal), raffles and of course private donations. The Council and I prefer raffles and private donations as this would not increase our APA, but we did want to ask. If you prefer a few second collections to help with the expenses mentioned above and no doubt others that will come along please call me at the office. Most of all many thanks to our Finance Council and 100th Anniversary Committee!

El domingo mundial de misiones nos hace recordar que nuestra iglesia es misionera. Nuestra parroquia fue una misión de la diócesis por muchos años también.

El evangelio de hoy es sobre el dinero y que podemos hacer con lo nuestro. Específicamente es sobre pagando impuestos a Cesar. Los fariseos están buscando una manera "de hacer caer a Jesús." Este capítulo de San Mateo es muy cerca del momento en que Cristo se va frente de Pilato. Los de Herodes le acercan echándole palabra buenas! "Maestro sabemos que eres sincero y enseñas con verdad el camino de Dios." Pero Jesús conoció sus intenciones: "Hipócritas, porque tratan de sorprenderme? Enséñame la moneda del tributo."

La respuesta de el es sutil. Jesús no toca la moneda. Luego les pregunto: "De quien es esta imagen y esta inscripción?" Le respondieron: "Del Cesar." Jesús dice en conclusión: "Den pues al Cesar lo que es del Cesar y a Dios lo que es de Dios."

La clave verdadera para nosotros es dar libremente el poco que tenemos. Jesús no dice que tenemos que pagar o no pagar un impuesto. El nos invita a una vida no controlada por el dinero. No importa sea gente pobre o rico.

El próximo Mayo nuestra comunidad de Sta. Rita va a empezar celebraciones para el 100 años de la parroquia. Fue un acuerdo entre los Benedictinos de San Leo y una comunidad pequeña de católicos en Dade City en 1912. Pero la primera misa fue realizado el día 4 de Marzo de 1913. Fue muy difícil para los Benedictinos venir acá en esos días. No hubo pavimentación o la ruta 52. Entonces fue un sacrificio grande para ellos empezando un parroquia en Dade City. Los Benedictinos tuvieron permiso de la diócesis para empezar misiones en esta parte del condado de Pasco.

Acercando a este momento muy grande para la comunidad necesitamos arreglar algunas cosas. En primer lugar vamos a pintar la iglesia. Hace un año y pico pintábamos el salón de la parroquia! Ya es la hora para pintar la iglesia. También el plaza de estacionamiento tenemos que arreglar y pintar. El consejo de Finanzas y yo queremos saber de tres opciones: segunda colecta (tal vez la colecta para el obispo va a subir si hacemos esta), rifas y donaciones privadas. Nosotros preferimos rifas y donaciones privadas porque no van a subir la meta del colecta del obispo así. Pero si quieres dos o tres veces una segunda colecta pues que me lo dicen. Simplemente vamos a tener gastos antes de celebrar la misión de 100 años de la parroquia. También quiero agradecer mucho el consejo de Finanzas y el comité del aniversario de 100 años!

Vatican II—Gaudium et Spes

As a result many persons are quite aggressively demanding those benefits of which with vivid awareness they judge themselves to be deprived either through injustice or unequal distribution. Nations on the road to progress, like those recently made independent, desire to participate in the goods of modern civilization, not only in the political field but also economically, and to play their part freely on the world scene. Still they continually fall behind while very often their economic and other dependence on wealthier nations advances more rapidly.

People hounded by hunger call upon those better off. Where they have not yet won it, women claim for themselves an equity with men before the law and in fact. Laborers and farmers seek not only to provide for the necessities of life, but to develop the gifts of their personality by their labors and indeed to take part in regulating economic, social, political and cultural life. Now, for the first time in human history all people are convinced that the benefits of culture ought to be and actually can be extended to everyone.

Still, beneath all these demands lies a deeper and more widespread longing: persons and societies thirst for a full and free life worthy of man; one in which they can subject to their own welfare all that the modern world can offer them so abundantly. In addition, nations try harder every day to bring about a kind of universal community.

Since all these things are so, the modern world shows itself at once powerful and weak, capable of the noblest deeds or the foulest; before it lies the path to freedom or to slavery, to progress or retreat, to brotherhood or hatred. Moreover, man is becoming aware that it is his responsibility to guide aright the forces which he has unleashed and which can enslave him or minister to him. That is why he is putting questions to himself.

Vaticano II—Gaudium et Spes

De aquí las instantes reivindicaciones económicas de muchísimos, que tienen viva conciencia de que la carencia de bienes que sufren se debe a la injusticia o a una no equitativa distribución. Las naciones en vía de desarrollo, como son las independizadas recientemente, desean participar en los bienes de la civilización moderna, no sólo en el plano político, sino también en el orden económico, y desempeñar libremente su función en el mundo. Sin embargo, está aumentando a diario la distancia que las separa de las naciones más ricas y la dependencia incluso económica que respecto de éstas padecen. Los pueblos hambrientos interpelan a los pueblos opulentos.

La mujer, allí donde todavía no lo ha logrado, reclama la igualdad de derecho y de hecho con el hombre. Los trabajadores y los agricultores no sólo quieren ganarse lo necesario para la vida, sino que quieren también desarrollar por medio del trabajo sus dotes personales y participar activamente en la ordenación de la vida económica, social, política y cultural. Por primera vez en la historia, todos los pueblos están convencidos de que los beneficios de la cultura pueden y deben extenderse realmente a todas las naciones.

Pero bajo todas estas reivindicaciones se oculta una aspiración más profunda y más universal: las personas y los grupos sociales están sedientos de una vida plena y de una vida libre, digna del hombre, poniendo a su servicio las inmensas posibilidades que les ofrece el mundo actual. Las naciones, por otra parte, se esfuerzan cada vez más por formar una comunidad universal.

De esta forma, el mundo moderno aparece a la vez poderoso y débil, capaz de lo mejor y de lo peor, pues tiene abierto el camino para optar entre la libertad o la esclavitud, entre el progreso o el retroceso, entre la fraternidad o el odio. El hombre sabe muy bien que está en su mano el dirigir correctamente las fuerzas que él ha desencadenado, y que pueden aplastarle o servirle. Por ello se interroga a sí mismo.

World Mission Day *“As the Father has sent me, even so I send you” (Jn 20:21)*

World Mission Day will be next Sunday, October 23, 2011, we'll have the Rosary with the children in Church during C.C.D Class, all are invited to join us to pray for all Missionaries around the world.

We forcefully reaffirmed the need to renew the commitment to bear the proclamation of the Gospel to everyone, sharing “the enthusiasm of the very first Christians” (Novo Millenio Inuente, # 58) It is the most precious service that the Church can render to humanity and to all individuals who are seeking the profound reasons to live their life to the full .

: “missionary activity renews the Church, revitalizes faith and Christian identity, and offers fresh enthusiasm and new incentive.

Faith is strengthened when it is given to others! It is in commitment to the Church's universal mission that the new evangelization of Christian peoples will find inspiration and support” (John Paul II, Encyclical Redemptoris Missio # 2) .

Pope John Paul II urged the faithful to be “watchful, ready to recognize his face and run to our brothers and sisters with the Good News: ‘We have seen the Lord!’” (Apostolic Letter Novo Millenio Inuente # 59).

The proclamation of the Gospel is intended for all peoples. The Church is “by her very nature missionary since, according to the plan of the Father, she has her origin in the mission of the Son and the Holy Spirit” (Decree on the Church's Missionary Activity Ad Gentes #2).

This is “the grace and vocation proper to the Church, her deepest identity. She exists in order to evangelize” (Paul VI, Apostolic Exhortation Evangelii Nuntiandi #14) .

Consequently she can never be closed in on herself. She is rooted in specific places in order to go beyond them. Her action, in adherence to Christ's word and under the influence of his grace and his charity, is fully and currently present to all people and all peoples, to lead them to faith in Christ, (cf. Ad Gentes # 5).

This task has lost none of its urgency. Indeed “The mission of Christ the Redeemer, which is entrusted to the Church, is still very far from completion... an overall view of the human race shows that this mission is still only beginning and that we must commit ourselves wholeheartedly to its service” (John Paul II, Encyclical Redemptoris Missio #1).

The universal mission involves all, all things and always. The Gospel is not an exclusive possession of whoever has received it but a gift to share, good news to communicate. And this gift-commitment is not only entrusted to a few but on the contrary to all the baptized, who are “a chosen race, a royal priesthood, a holy nation, God's own people” (1 Pt 2:9), so that they may declare his wonderful deeds.
